CHEATSHEET FOR BECOMING A CANDIDATE AND INTERN

READ BCO CHAPTERS 18 AND 19

- 1. After holding membership at a PCA church for at least six months, receive the endorsement of your local Session and have that endorsement communicated appropriately to presbytery (BCO 18-2).
- 2. Come "under care" of your Presbytery.
 - A. To come under care you must contact the <u>clerk of Presbytery</u> and the Chairman of the Candidates committee at least <u>one month</u> before the meeting of the Presbytery (BCO 18-2).
 - B. Meet with Candidates Committee in person before Presbytery meeting.
 - C. Be examined in person at the Presbytery meeting in which you come under care (BCO 18-3).
- 3. Submit an Internship Application (and Application of Internship Cooperative Agreement, if appropriate) to the Chairman of the MO Presbytery Candidates Committee <u>at least six weeks before</u> the Presbytery meeting to be approved as an Intern (BCO 19-11).
- 4. Be approved as an Intern.

**Note: Steps 2 & 4 may take place during the same Presbytery meeting (BCO 19-8).

How to complete your Internship:

- 1. Submit Quarterly reports (updated Internship Checklist and Intern Report Form) to report your progress <u>before</u> each Presbytery meeting to the committee chair (BCO 18-6, 19-12). You must complete an internship lasting at least one year (BCO 19-7).
- Complete all the required activities on the internship checklist over a period of at least a year.
- 3. Email or mail the committee Chair your completed checklist signed by your mentor at least a month before the presbytery meeting at which you wish to have your internship approved.

Notes:

- 1. Previous experience may count toward the completion of the checklist, but only with the *explicit permission of the committee Chair*. Generally, checklist requirements completed after the start of Seminary will count.
- 2. Without the completion of a presbytery supervised internship, you may not be ordained in the PCA.
- 3. Generally presbyteries have a reciprocal agreement concerning internships.
- 4. A presbytery may, for sufficient reasons, remove the candidate from the rolls of presbytery. A candidate may also withdraw his candidacy at his request (BCO 18-7).
